### esident of the Month - Ken Thorneycroft



Ken Thorneycroft was born in Swift Current, Saskatchewan where he was an avid Air Cadet during his high school years. After graduation, he knew he wanted to become a pilot. His first posting was in Portage la Prairie where he joined the military. He was then posted to Clinton, Ontario for six months, where he learned how to fix and replace communication systems. As the military began to train more pilots, Ken was posted to Centralia, Ontario where he started his formal aviation training. Thus began 37 years of flying with the Canadian Air Force on many different kinds of aircraft including: F86 Sabre, Harvard, Vampire and CF104 Starfighter. One significant memory of his early years as a pilot was when Ken participated in "Operation Leapfrog" in 1953. Three squadrons of F86 Sabres flew from Canada to Greenland, then on to Iceland and Scotland, before landing in Grostenguin, France. The squadron Ken flew with was

stranded in Greenland for a week due to poor weather conditions, before the final leg was flown. It was quite a thrilling experience being part of such a huge operation.

While posted in St. Hubert, Quebec, Ken met a beautiful young nurse from the Eastern Townships who captured his heart. Joan and Ken were eventually married in 1953 and enjoyed 59 years together. They had two daughters and a son and were fortunate to have lived all over Canada, Europe and the United States. Ken retired from the military in 1983 as a Lieutenant General after a very successful career. Ken now spends his days at Orchard View by the Mississippi walking, reading and enjoying time with his family.

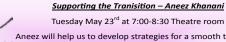
