Resident of the Month: Don Wiles

CURA/ARUCC Tribute Award Presented to Donald Wiles Carleton University Retirees Association Award Citation



Don Wiles has been part of Carleton University for most of its existence. He has played a vital role in the university as a teacher for 54 years, (a record unlike ever to be equaled), an administrator (as chair of Chemistry for 12 years), a researcher, an expert in radioactive waste disposal and as a perpetual goad in the side of senior management.

He has been incredibly generous both with his time but also financially, and prizes in his name are awarded for excellence in teaching by TA's in all the science departments. These accomplishments were recognized by the award of an Honorary Degree in 2011.

Don not only contributed to the development of life long learning at Carleton but also developed a satellite operation based in his hometown of Almonte, initially by the individual lectures but subsequently by six-week courses in the style of Learning in Retirement. He encouraged the interaction of Carleton with various community centers around Ottawa and as a result many of us have given lectures to a wider audience.

However his nomination is based on his foundation for the Carleton University Retirees Association (CURA). The inaugural meeting of the CURA was held October 20th, 2006. It was founded on Don's initiative and he became the organization's first president, serving in this role until 2012. He worked very hard to force the university to recognize its retirees and he assisted in creating an MOU between CURA and the university. This active role has continued into his 90's.

A Dog's Love

Was it love, admiration, wonder, pride or disbelief? I don't know, but every Thursday afternoon for five years I experienced all of these emotions during our two-hour sessions at an Almonte nursing home with my Standard Poodle, Kirby. Not once during those five years did I have to correct him. He knew quite naturally how to approach a resident and what to do for each.



However, this story is about one resident in particular. She was quite elderly and had withdrawn into her own world. We heard about her one Thursday when we received our instructions from the nursing station and were told it wouldn't be worth while spending much time with her as she wouldn't know we were there. After a few moments with this lady I had agreed with this advice and was ready to leave her side but Kirby resisted leaving. He gave her limp hand a little nudge with his nose every few minutes and while we eventually had to move on I was puzzled by his reaction.

We continued to visit her each week and after many weeks I saw her figure move. I rushed to tell the nurses only to be told that it was probably an involuntary movement. But we continued to visit and yes, one week we saw her hand move. Weeks later she was making soft sounds and we were thrilled, especially Kirby. She continued to make sounds that began to sound like words and one hand would go out to touch Kirby's ear. Oh, what wonderful progress! She tried so hard to talk and while it was just noise everyone was thrilled with the progress. And then one day we were all dumbfounded when she clearly said "Blackie come home". We tried to determine what she meant and decided that when she entered the home she had been separated from her dog Blackie and at long last they were reunited!

Sadly, it was not much later that we were told she had died of a stroke. I always wondered whether Kirby understood why he could no longer visit his friend and what had prompted his determination to communicate with a person who had been unresponsive for so long.

This is just one of my remarkable experiences with Kirby and his love of those needing his companionship.


