Resident of the Month: Pat Kennedy

Pat was born in Detroit, Michigan on January 15, 1934. She was the youngest of 12 children, eight boys and four girls. Her father and three of her brothers went off to fight in the war so her mother raised the rest of her children on her own. Pat's parents had moved from England and got married in Lachine, Quebec. They had their first four children in Canada and then moved to Detroit for his work. Pat lived in Detroit until she was five, when the family all moved back to Lachine.

She was in school there until she began working at Dominion Engineering full time as a receptionist and had to finish high school doing night classes. She worked at the same company, which was later named General Electrics, for 40 years. She had to be bilingual for her job so she went to McGill and took French. She worked for General Electric up till when she retired.

Growing up, she always helped her neighbours, running errands or doing whatever she could to help them out. Her mother brought her up to always help when she could and never ask for anything in return. That's how Pat lived the rest of her life.

She has many interests and has pursued numerous different hobbies over the years. She took a woodworking class for four years. She also did figure skating when she was younger and even skated with international gold medalist Toller Cranston. She played semi-pro softball in her 20s and travelled with the team on the weekends for games. She coached a little league baseball team called the Lakeshore Lions and umpired when needed. She taught a majorette's class, coached cheerleading, and even did time-keeping for minor hockey.

She met her husband, Arthur, when she was doing time-keeping and he was general manager for the A team, the Lachine Maroons. His team would practice before or after the minor hockey games and he saw Pat doing the time-keeping and asked to be introduced to her. He later asked her to be secretary for the A team he managed, a volunteer position which she accepted. Arthur asked her out for coffee and they started dating. He began working for the NHL as a statistician for the Montreal Canadiens. He travelled with the team, and Pat got to watch many of their games.

Pat and Arthur got married in Lachine on October 7, 1967. Arthur worked for the NHL for 50 years and only missed one hockey game. He loved hockey so much that he would even come home from working a game and stay up to watch the west coast games that started late. Pat asked him one day whether his love lay with her or with hockey. In reply, he jokingly said, "Well, you're well ahead of basketball!"

Pat and Arthur were close to many of the players and staff on the Montreal Canadiens team, including the general manager and Pat got to sit with many of the wives of the players at games. They went to the Stanley Cup parties and when Arthur passed away in 2007, many of the players were the pallbearers. Pat and Arthur moved to Almonte in 1991 when Arthur retired. Pat started volunteering at Fairview Manor and was vice president of the Auxiliary for 21 years. She also volunteered at the Carp Fair with the horse shows, helping the judges and organizing the contestants.

When asked about places she travelled to, Pat said most of their travelling was for different hockey games, like going to Tampa Bay and Vancouver. She also went to the British Isles on a 21-day cruise as well as a river cruise through Germany, Austria and Hungary in retirement with three friends.

Pat has dedicated much of her life and time to volunteer work and helping others. The thing she is most proud of is being awarded the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Volunteering Award for her volunteer work at Fairview Manor and for helping out in the community. She was also awarded volunteer of the year by the mayor of Ottawa, Jim Watson and was nominated as a "Guardian Angel" through the Almonte General Hospital Foundation for her volunteering.

Since she's moved into Orchard View, her volunteering and commitment to helping others out haven't slowed down at all. She has made almost 100 name tag pins for residents and staff, made walker bags, and done countless mending, sewing and fixing jobs for residents and staff. She offers her help whenever and wherever she can. She loves to be busy and use her time to help others. She told me how happy she is at Orchard View and how she loves the staff and other residents and has no complaints. Pat's selfless attitude and commitment to volunteering are an inspiration. We are happy she is part of our OVM family and wish her all the best.
