Resident of the Month:

Gail remembers her childhood years with great fondness – living along the Ottawa River (the area taken over to eventually create the Ottawa River Parkway) in houses that always seemed too small for 8 people but were always the coziest and happiest of places. There were two older sisters, two older brothers with a twin sister coming along with Gail to round out the family.

She went to Broadview Public School in Ottawa where her father was the head custodian. Gail's mother had also attended Broadview Public School as a young child. After finishing high school at Champlain, Gail went to work as an office manager in the Ottawa area for a private company. A year later she had accepted a position at Statistics Canada and in the years following, she moved on to work as a legal assistant, also within the Federal Government.

Ten years later she applied for a civilian position in the military. It was here she met her husband Jim, a Major in the Royal Canadian Airforce. It wasn't too long after entering married life, that along came a posting to Goose Bay, Labrador. This was a semi-isolation posting and as Gail put it, "it was the best of times, it was the worst of times"; Jim was Head of the Radar Squadron and thus they had a wonderful view of the surrounding area as well as a great aerial view of the Military site.

Asked to stay on for an additional year to the original two year posting, they then moved back to Ottawa. Perfect timing with Jim's two now teenaged boys, city life allowed them to settle into a more normal sort of life. Gail remembers with great fondness, one of Jim's young sons had found a way to connect with her; he brought home a book of jokes one day as he knew Gail loved a good joke. Eventually the jokes had to be limited to 5 a night – great memories of those years raising the boys. (The picture of Gail & Jim was taken in 2002 at this young man's wedding – happy times.)

After his retirement from the Airforce, Jim went to work for Supply and Services Canada as a private contractor. He



developed an evaluation system that did not evaluate based on the lowest bidder but instead on what they could give the Department for the best price. Gail joined him, her job to work out the averages, Jim being the overseer. They worked together for 15 years. It was at this point Gail began noticing subtle changes in Jim. His very alert mind had started to be not so alert. Shortly after Jim was diagnosed with Dementia. They wrapped up their business dealings and went home. For the next 20 years, Gail watched Jim decline at home. Eventually she had to put his name on an emergency list for Long Term Care. He then moved to Fairview Manor here in Almonte where he lived another 7 years and during the worst of Covid, he passed away.

Gail moved to Orchard View by the Mississippi in August of 2021. In Gail's own words, "Although I have felt heartache and loss, Orchard View is a wonderful place to live. I have made many friends and have had lots of laughs and enjoyment. I am a quiet person and like to keep to myself, but have



been known to chat and laugh in the halls." A little sidenote – since coming to Orchard View, Gail has made acquaintance with another resident who also grew up in the same area of Ottawa as a young child – small world, indeed.

Gail is blessed to have one of her sister's daughters and her two great nieces live near enough to be able to visit on a regular basis.

Thank you, Gail, for sharing your story with me, and all of us. It is always wonderful to get to know the person behind the face.
